

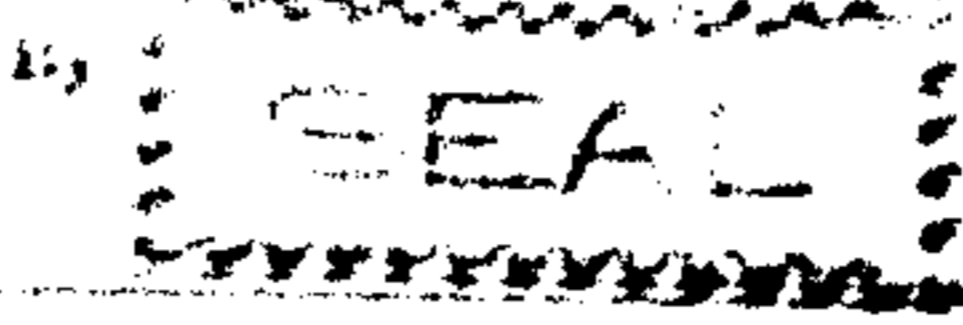

To all to Whom These Presents Shall Come, Greeting:

Homestead Certificate No. *240*

Application *6718*

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at *Butte*

Alaska Territory

whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th of May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual Settlers on the Public Domain," and to acts supplemental thereto, the claim of *James Johnson*

has been established and duly consummated, in conformity to law for the *South West quarter of Section one in Township four North Range two West of Range Meridian in Chitina Territory containing one hundred and sixty acres*

according to the Official Plat of the survey of the said land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

Now Know Ye, That there is, therefore, granted by the United States unto the said *James Johnson*

the tract of land above described, to have and to hold the said tract of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *James Johnson* and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I *James Johnson*

President of the United States of America, have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
